City of Coventry (Clifford Park Estate) (Residents Parking Zone) (Experimental) Order 2015 ("the Experimental Order")

The effect of the Experimental Order is to introduce residents' parking restrictions (24 hours a day 7 days a week) and other waiting restrictions to prevent/reduce parking and improve road safety on the following lengths of road:-

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 256
NOTICE is given in accordance with the provisions of the Highways Act 1980 section 256, that for the purpose of straightening or otherwise adjusting the boundaries of the highway maintainable at the public expense located at Manor House Drive near to Sherbourne House in the City of Coventry the Council proposes as the highway authority for the highway to enter into an agreement with Pollus Investment Limited of KCS Chambers PO Box 4051 Road Town Tortola British Virgin Islands ("the Owner") who is the owner of land adjoining or lying near to the highway.

The particulars of the proposed agreement are as follows:-

1. There shall be transferred by the Owner to the Council an area of land of approximately 271 square metres adjacent to Manor House Drive.
2. There shall be transferred by the Council to the Owner an area of land of approximately 311 square metres within the current boundaries of the highway known as Manor House Drive.

NOTICE OF MAKING CITY OF COVENTRY (CITY CENTRE RESTRICTED PARKING ZONE) (PERMITTED PARKING AREA AND SPECIAL PARKING AREA) (DESIGNATION, WAITING RESTRICTIONS, LOADING RESTRICTIONS, LOADING AREAS AND STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2012 – (VARIATION 4) ORDER 2015

Coventry City Council ("the Council"), under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended), has made the above Order ("the Order"), which comes into operation on 23rd January 2015.

The Order varies the City of Coventry (City Centre Restricted Parking Zone) (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Designation, Waiting Restrictions, Loading Restrictions, Loading Areas and Street Parking Places) Order 2012, and shall have the following effects:-

Road	Variation
St Johns Street	Increase the length of pay on street parking on the southern side of St Johns Street by 1 parking bay (approx. 6m)
Hay Lane	Remove evening taxi rank (6pm to 8am) and retain loading bay, in operation 8am - 6pm, loading period restricted to 20 minutes.
Earl Street	Amend the 24 hour loading only bay outside the Council House to Permit holders only
Gosford Street	Removal of (30 minute) limited waiting bays due to new road layout. Installation of no waiting at any time on approach to Sky Blue Way roundabout junction.
Lower Ford Street	Installation of limited waiting bays (8am - 6pm, 1 hour no return within 2 hours)
Far Gosford Street	Installation of loading bay (8am - 6pm)
To extend the restricted zone to include:	The whole of Gosford Street Far Gosford Street (from its junction with Vequery Street) Gosford Street to its junction with Vequery Street Lower Ford Street (southern section from its junction with Far Gosford Street to its cul de sac end) New Union Street (extending 18m towards junction 5)

The proposed waiting restriction changes, together with the proposed changes the road layout, will assist to maintain low speeds and provide dedicated loading facilities.

When the Order was advertised on 6th November 2014, the title was 'City of Coventry (City Centre Restricted Parking Zone) (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Designation, Waiting Restrictions, Loading Restrictions, Loading Areas and Street Parking Places) Order 2012 – (Variation 4) Order 2014'. The title has since been changed to that above.
