TEMPORARY TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS
FAR GOSFORD STREET

Coventry City Council, under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (as amended), has made a temporary order, the effect of which will be to prohibit driving of any vehicles on Far Gosford Street from Vespary Street to its junction with Bramble Street from 08.00 hours to 17.00 hours on Sunday 18th September 2011 to allow electricity supplies to be upgraded safely.

TEMPORARY TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS
ROAD AND FOOTPATH CLOSURES - VARIOUS ROADS (17)

Coventry City Council, under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (as amended), has made a temporary Order, the effect of which will be to prohibit driving of any vehicles on the following road and walking and cycling on the following footpath:-

Brick Hill Lane from its junction with the A45 Birmingham Road to its junction with Oak Lane; and
The footpath from number 1 Alpina Rise (North) to number 49 Alpina Rise (South).

The closure will take effect from Monday 19th September 2011 to allow drainage repairs and associated works to be undertaken safely. The maximum duration of this order is six months but it is envisaged that the proposed works will take six (6) weeks and the order will thereafter be revoked.

Diversion routes for road users and pedestrians will be sign posted. Exemptions will be provided for emergency and local authority vehicles and vehicles being used in connection with the works.
